Transformation to Low Emissions and Resilient Agrifood System:

A Knowledge Exchange Event and Climate Policy Negotiations Training

BACKGROUND



The ASEAN Climate Resilience Network is established in 2014 as a platform- to ensure that the agriculture sector of ASEAN member states (AMS) is in a better position to adapt to climate change and optimize its mitigation potential.

The ASEAN Climate Resilience Network (ASEAN-CRN) is established in 2014 by the ASEAN Technical Working Group on Agricultural Research and Development (ATWGARD) -as a platform- to ensure that the agriculture sector of ASEAN member states (AMS) is in a better position to adapt to climate change and optimize its mitigation potential. The network promotes climate resiliency through the exchange of information, expertise, and experiences on climate smart approaches to food systems. Since its formation, the ASEAN-CRN has significantly advanced the agenda of agriculture and climate change in ASEAN by providing a dialogue platform and linking policymakers and the scientific community (<https://asean-crn.org/>). ASEAN-CRN has also supported the establishment of the ASEAN Negotiating Group for Agriculture (ANGA) which has engaged with the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in shaping policies relevant to agriculture.

As per the 7th ASEAN-CRN Annual Meeting in 2022, the top priority or interest of ASEAN-CRN focal points was expressed as enhancing

understanding of net zero and low carbon emissions in the agriculture and land use sectors. Achieving net zero in agriculture is challenging and will require steps to both reduce emissions and capture and store carbon through soils and forests. During a prioritization exercise and follow up discussions, the ASEAN-CRN members expressed greater need to understand how agriculture can help achieve the country's climate pledges. This was also voiced by ANGA who attended the SB56 The fifty-sixth session of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI)] in Bonn, Germany, during 6-16 June 2022, with support from ASEAN-CRN. The experience from the sessions underscored the need for further trainings of new ANGA focal points to help strengthen their understanding and capacities in these key and emerging new topics. The Koronivia Joint Work on Agriculture (KJWA) was continually considered, to report and recommend a decision for adoption at COP27. In preparation for COP27, and internal strategic meeting to support a unified engagement, it is necessary to organize an event to accommodate such needs mentioned. Therefore, this multi-event that combines all the needs above is being organized by ASEAN-CRN with support from GIZ under the "Promotion of Sustainable Agricultural Value Chains in ASEAN" (ASEAN AgriTrade) project, FAO-Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific (RAP), Enhanced Regional EU-ASEAN Dialogue Instrument (E-READI), and Mekong Institute (MI) on behalf of the ASEAN AgriTrade project.

The event is organized together with Thailand Department of Agriculture (DOA) as Chair of ASEAN-CRN and hosted by the National Research and Innovation Agency (BRIN), Republic of Indonesia who currently chairs the ASEAN Negotiating Group for Agriculture (ANGA) and a founding member of ASEAN-CRN.

3. Guidance for ANGA preparation for further negotiation

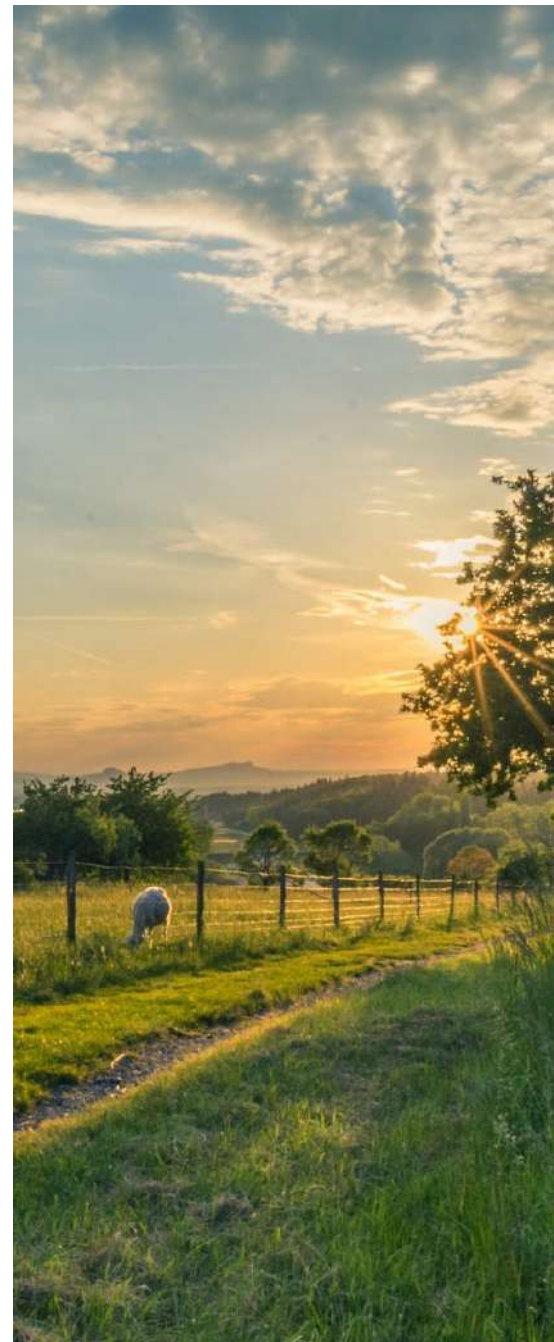
